UNISON— UNISON has a charity called There for You that can help members with financial difficulties by providing grants.

Citizens Advice — Citizens advice is a place to go for advice on a wide range of issues. The Citizens Advice service helps people to resolve their problems, and as the UK's largest advice provider they are equipped to deal with any issue, from anyone, spanning debt and employment to housing.

Shelter — As well as providing shelter to the most vulnerable people in society, shelter also have a lot of helpful information on the true cost of private renting.

Turn2us — Turn2us are an amazing charity that helps people in financial need gain access to welfare benefits, charitable grants and other financial help. They also have a very helpful calculator on their website that will work out what you're entitled to.

Housing Federation — The housing federation have a number of helpful resources including busting housing jargon and information on the welfare reform.
